The Student Survey is a series of questions that you can complete on the computer or with a pen and paper. It asks questions about you, how supported you feel at school, your experiences in and out of school and what kind of services you receive in and out of school. Some of the questions will ask you about your education plans, your experiences with race and culture, and how you see yourself. Other questions ask about your views and experience with respect in your school. If you have any questions during the survey, you can ask one of us giving the survey. Every question is important, and it is very helpful to us if you can answer as many as you are comfortable.

These surveys are being done by students like you at these three schools: H.B. Lee Middle School, Reynolds Middle School and Reynolds High School. Students taking these surveys are involved in programs led by IRCO, Latino Network, Metropolitan Family Service, NAYA Family Center and SEI. The surveys are being done as part of a research study with Successful Families 2020, which includes all the organizations I already listed, Portland State University (PSU) and United Way of the Columbia-Willamette to learn more about your experiences in and out of school and how to improve programs so that students can be successful and graduate. While we do share your information from this survey with PSU and United Way, we will not share your name publicly. We will assign a number to your answers so that your name is not attached. This helps with our research project, while keeping your answers private. We will ask you to complete this survey again at the end of the year, and next year if you're still in these schools and programs.
