ALICE: NEARLY HALF OF OREGON HOUSEHOLDS CAN'T AFFORD THE BASICS.

Everything is expensive ... and as a single mother with no help, it's really hard for me to manage all the bills, work, spend time with the kids.

Across our region, too many families are walking a financial tightrope. According to the 2025 State of ALICE in Oregon report, 42% of Oregon households, more than 737,000 families, struggle to afford life's basics like housing, child care, and health care.

These are our essential workers—the Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed (ALICE) families—child care providers, grocery clerks, delivery drivers, and caregivers who keep our communities running. They earn too much to qualify for most assistance programs, yet not enough to make ends meet.

At United Way of the Columbia-Willamette, we're working to close that gap, supporting ALICE families with access to safe housing, quality child care, and community resources that build long-term stability.


BELOW THE FEDERAL POVERTY LINE

At United Way of the Columbia-Willamette, we believe every family deserves the security of a safe and stable home. Yet too many of our neighbors live just one unexpected bill – a car repair, a medical expense–away from losing that stability.



The Resilient Families Fund meets families where they are, helping them stay housed through eviction prevention, rent and utility assistance, and essential wraparound services.

BY THE NUMBERS:

- 3,800+ households kept in their homes
- \$2,700 average cost to prevent an eviction
- 90% of families remain housed after six months
- 93% don't need additional assistance

In November 2024, United Way of the Columbia-Willamette proudly became an operational partner with Dolly Parton's Imagination Library (DPIL). Each month, a book arrives at a child's doorstep, free of cost to the family. Parents read more with their children. Kids enter kindergarten ready to learn. Families build lifelong habits of literacy and a love for reading.

Full Oregon Coverage:

With United Way stepping in, Oregon's three most populous counties, previously without local management, are now covered, meaning every child under age five in Oregon can receive books monthly at no cost.

Bilingual Access:

Families can now receive books in English and Spanish, expanding inclusion and access for thousands of children statewide.

Exponential Growth:

In just one year, enrollment has more than doubled, proving the deep hunger for early learning support and the power of community partnership.



BUILDING A MORE RESILIENT OREGON - TOGETHER

When disaster strikes, our greatest strength is each other. United Way of the Columbia-Willamette is advancing disaster resilience across Oregon, because every person deserves a voice in shaping our climate-resilient future.

Our Disaster Resilience department values a people-centered approach to mitigating the harms of disasters in Oregon.

We bring together disaster-impacted leaders, community-based organizations, government, and funders to reimagine how emergency preparedness, recovery, and resilience can truly serve everyone—especially those historically left out of these systems.

Climate change and rising costs are deepening existing inequities. Nearly half of Oregon households live below the ALICE Threshold–earning too much to qualify for assistance but too little to withstand crisis. When climate disasters happen, it's these families and working-class communities who face the greatest harm and the fewest resources to recover.

That's why our work is peoplecentered and community-led. We invest in local innovations, uplift culturally rooted resilience practices, and advocate for equitable, inclusive access to life-saving preparedness resources.

Because when we prepare, respond, and recover together, our entire region grows stronger. United is the Way we are resilient.
